





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November 3, 2020 Presidential General Election

All voting options will follow COVID-19 health protocols.

There is still time to **return your ballot!** You can mail your ballot in the postage-paid envelope, drop it off at a secure Ballot Drop Box or go to any accessible Vote Center by 8 p.m. on November 3.

If you choose to return your voted ballot by mail, it must be **postmarked by Election Day, Tuesday, November 3, 2020**, and received no later than November 20, 2020 in order to be accepted.
